New diagnosis of IBS in the >50s

Be aware

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New onset 'overactive bladder'/ 'recurrent UTI' in >50s

- Ovarian cancer may be misdiagnosed as irritable bowel syndrome (IBS), overactive bladder or recurrent urinary tract infection.
- First presentation with IBS in the >50s is rare.
- Women in this age group who have experienced recurrent symptoms within the last 12 months that suggest IBS should be offered a CA125 blood test and considered for USS pelvis and abdomen.
- Recurrent symptoms of 'urinary tract infection' should always be investigated by sending the mid-stream urine for culture.
- If the urine is repeatedly sterile, and the woman is >50, a CA125 blood test and USS pelvis and abdomen should be considered.
