
A Co-ordinator's guide to running a Pop-up connection

Introduction

Thank you for downloading this guide and considering organising a Pop-up connection.

Our community told us that meeting others affected by ovarian cancer in person and sharing experiences with those that understand is invaluable.

We know that peer support is incredibly valuable, and we have a vision where everyone affected by ovarian cancer can connect with others in their local community. Each activity that you organise and that we promote moves us closer to that vision. Your support is vital.



Pop-up connections

What is a Pop-up connection?

An informal, community-based activity co-ordinated by someone affected by ovarian cancer, for others affected by ovarian cancer.

I'm interested in co-ordinating a Pop-up connection. What could I organise?

That's up to you, but if you're looking for inspiration, here are some of our favourite ideas:

- Meet up for a cup of tea and a chat
- Try a creative activity together such as crafting, creative writing or even singing
- Get together and stay active by going for a walk, working on an allotment or trying a Target Ovarian Cancer virtual yoga class
- Pop out for lunch or even a picnic and catch up over some delicious food
- Watch a Target Ovarian Cancer digital support event together

Who would attend?

This is your choice too, you might want to restrict attendees to just those with a diagnosis, or family members and friends of someone with a diagnosis. You might be happy for it to be both. We will ask you about who you want your event to be for, when you fill in our activity registration form.

Pop-up connections

How can I get started?

If you have an idea and would like to run a pop-up connection in your community, we're here to support you every step of the way:

- This lets us know what you would like to do, where and when.

- We promote your Pop-up connection

 We will create a post in our <u>online communities</u> (In Touch and the Ovarian Cancer Community) promoting your activity. We will also share the details with members of our community who live nearby by email.
- 3 We create a WhatsApp group to connect you with others who wish to attend

We will share a link so that you and those who are interested in attending can join a WhatsApp group specifically for the activity, so you can get to know each other in advance and make final arrangements to meet.

We'll get in touch after your activity

To find out how it went, check if you or
any attendees need any extra support
and to check if we can share details
about your event with our community.

Before your event

To ensure a smooth activity we suggest that you do the following before the day of your event

Think about how to keep yourself and the participants safe

Safety

We will only be able to promote activities that are in line with our organisational health and safety policy. We would always recommend meeting in a public space and avoiding one to one meet-ups.

Privacy

Any personal data shared with you as part of the process of organising a Pop-up connection should not be shared with anyone else. Examples include email addresses, telephone numbers, postal addresses.

Use the WhatsApp group

As the co-ordinator of the activity, we will make you admin of the group (Target Ovarian Cancer staff are also admins). We'd encourage you to introduce yourself and to use the group to start a conversation with those who plan to attend: it's a great opportunity to break the ice and to get to know each other. It's also great for communicating any last-minute changes of plan. We'd encourage you to keep an eye on the group on a daily basis and to report any concerns about the group to the community admins.

During your event

What to talk about

It might feel daunting when you first meet, but those nerves will fade once you get chatting. We know that our community often find sharing their experiences with one another helpful, so perhaps you'll chat about your own or your loved one's diagnosis, treatment and how you've felt throughout. Or maybe you'd rather take the focus off ovarian cancer and just get to know one another – that's okay too. It's your get together, so you can make it your own.

Confidentiality

During the get together, some people may choose to share details of personal experiences. Please remember this may be sensitive and private and should not be shared outside of the group.

Remember that everyone is at different stages and coping differently, so please keep this in mind. Be kind and respectful when others share their thoughts, experiences and concerns.

Everyone has different circumstances and situations, so things such as access to certain treatment options may differ. Any information shared and tips given are not a substitute for medical advice. Please always ask a medical professional before making any health decisions.

During your event

Health concerns and signposting to Target Ovarian Cancer services

If something health-related or emotionally difficult comes up during the activity, our supportive services are here for you and the other attendees.

The WhatsApp group

We will chat with you as the connection co-ordinator about what you wish to happen with the group. Our intention is to keep the groups open until there has been no activity within them in the last month and at this point, we will close them down. It may be that you or one of the other attendees wants to use the group to start planning another Pop-up connection in your area, it could be that you decide to set up your own WhatsApp group instead.

All we ask is that someone in the group shares the plan for any future activities with us (so that we can help promote them) and then lets us know the numbers of people who attended to help us track our impact.
